TREE WARDEN REPORT

Owing to personal and environmental relocation issues I have not been as active over the past year as in previous years. Nevertheless I have continued with our "greening up the village " theme by supplying several parishioners with trees for garden planting and by replacing ten beech hedge saplings, lost to a dry spell, with more mature specimens on the south west boundary of the community centre which are doing well.

A request is ongoing at present from a parishioner to supply a small orchard when the area is cleared during the next few months.
