Many WI members took part and we had gathered together about 50 wedding dresses from 1936 - 2023 which gave quite a few headaches for display but in the end the church looked fantastic and our efforts raised funds for the church. All the photos are displayed on the Parish website. The event was designed to be cost effective should Covid raise its head again and the display models were begged and borrowed from a number of generous sources.

Being a member of the WI gives us the chance to take part in other activities organised by our local Federation and this year some of us have taken part in quizzes, kurling and embroidery workshops. Some of us attended the Resolutions Day in March which is when we listen in more depth to the resolutions shortlist from which one is chosen to go forward to this years AGM at the Albert Hall.

Last years chosen resolution was to campaign for Cleaner Bathing Waters which as we all know is a much needed campaign and the WI voted to add its voice to campaign with other campaign groups.

We like to be involved where we can in village life and to this end The WI has agreed to take care of one of the Parish Council planters. On WI Day in September you may well see it decorated in the WI colours.

And we are also providing the lunch on the Village Spring Clean morning in May. In previous years we have cleaned the village signs so if you notice them looking a little more sparkly you'll know who was behind the clean!
